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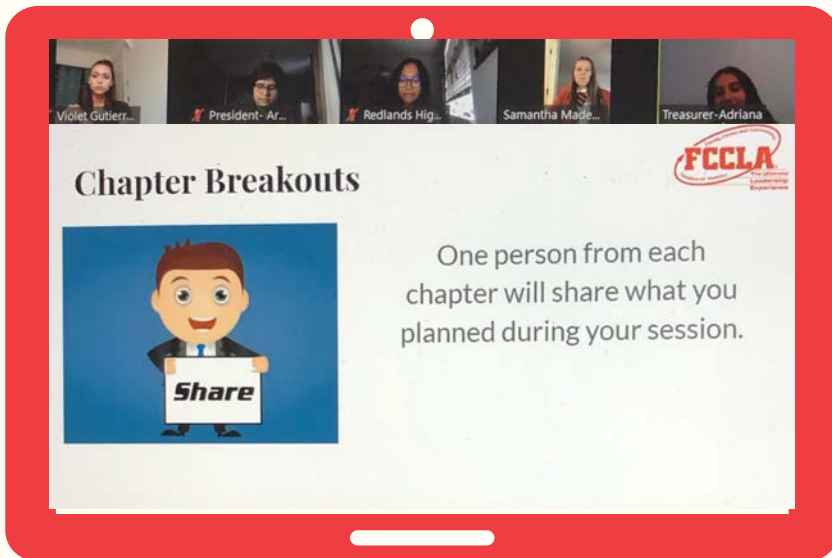
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Chapter Officer Leadership Trainings

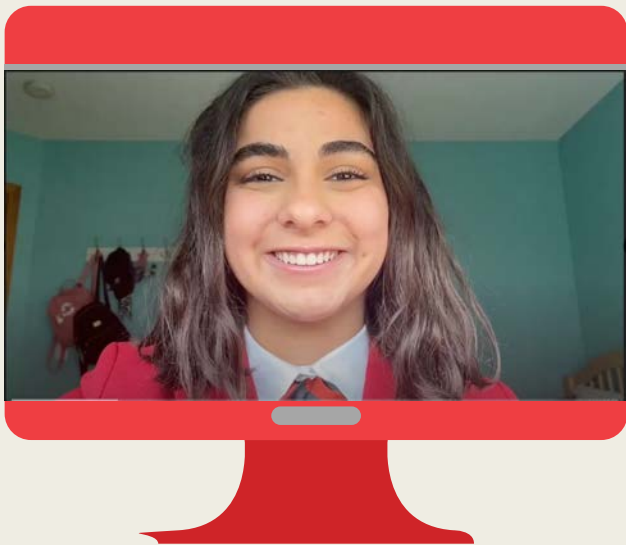

To kick us off, Sapriya Patel, National FCCLA's President, made a keynote speech about her FCCLA journey!

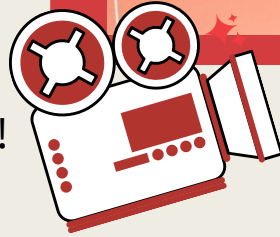

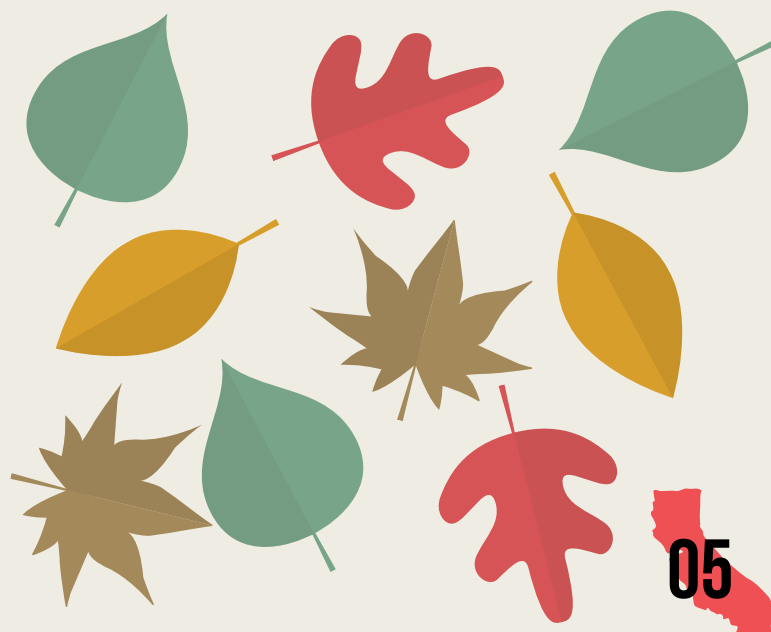

THE GO FOR RED MEMBERSHIP AWARD



The Go For Red Membership Award focuses on rewarding members for sharing their positive FCCLA experience with friends. FCCLA's annual membership campaign provides incentive for members and chapters to increase membership through recruiting, retaining, and recognizing members.

For recruitment, you can sponsor a “bring a buddy” campaign and encourage them to join by bringing them to a regional meeting where they can learn more about FCCLA! You can even volunteer to help with new student orientation activities where you can promote FCCLA as an activity for students!

For retainment, you can hold fundraisers throughout the year to support the cost of dues for affiliation or regional meetings! In addition, you can hold fun events such as leadership workshops, community service projects, and more!

For recognition, your chapter can create a “member of the week” program highlighting the member and all their accomplishments, or you can even make a chapter newsletter that can be sent out to chapter members, their parents, and school administrators!

Not only that, but members can gain individual awards when they recruit 3 or more members! Those who meet the qualifications and deadlines will receive a certificate and will be entered into a drawing for prizes. All members who attend NLC will also receive a special Go For the Red ribbon.

In addition, chapters who increase their members by 10 (bronze), 15 (silver), or 20 (gold) members from the previous year can apply for the chapter award! Chapters who qualify and meet the deadline will receive a certificate and will be entered into a drawing to also win prizes.

Red Rose Award

This year California FCCLA has created a new award named the Red Rose Award! This award is catered toward first year members as a way to get them involved through learning about FCS and FCCLA within their local chapter and demonstrating leadership!

Applications are due November 1, 2020, to be awarded at Spring Meeting, or March 1, 2021, to be awarded at the State Leadership Conference! Applications are posted on the CA FCCLA website.



POWER OF ONE

The National program, Power of One, is one of the three programs that we will be featuring this year!



Power of One focuses on helping members find their personal power through setting goals, working to achieve them, and enjoying the results. Through utilizing Power of One, members can learn skills to help them now in the future with school, friends and family, and on the job. The five units include:

1. A Better You, where members work to improve their personal traits.
2. Family Ties, where members work to get along better with their family members.
3. Working on Working, where members explore work options, prepare for a career, or sharpen skills useful in business
4. Take the Lead, where members develop leadership qualities
5. Speak Out for FCCLA, where members tell others about their positive experiences in FCCLA.

To get started, members can print out the Planning Process Sheet which lists out the steps for members to begin working toward their goals!

Upon completion of all five Power of One units, members can fill out the Power of One application located on the CA FCCLA website to receive recognition and pin! In addition, as part of the Golden State Degrees, members are required to participate and complete one unit of Power of One for a Chapter Degree, three units for a Region Degree, and five units for a State Degree.

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
